
THE BELL TOWER

It is my pleasure to announce the Reverend Meredith Holt has been called as the 26th rector of Grace Episcopal Church Galveston.

In June of last year I started lining out all that we needed to do to find a new rector. We didn't know who our interim was going to be, we hadn't met with the Diocese yet, and had absolutely no idea where this journey would take us. The only thing that I knew for sure at that time was that God was guiding us through this process and had already picked who our new rector would be and would lead us down that sometimes rocky road.



At our core values meeting the idea of using the scripture "I am the vine; you are the branches" as our theme was first discussed. The brochure committee subsequently adopted that theme for our Parish Profile. At that time we had no idea that the day the search committee would meet to confirm their choice of a new rector would be the very Sunday when this was the gospel reading.

Meredith+ was baptized at St. George's, New Orleans and confirmed at St. Thomas, College Station. She spent her early years living in Rhode Island, California and Hawaii. She graduated from Claremont McKenna College in Southern California with a degree in neuroscience and religious studies.

While in college, she also studied tropical ecology in Costa Rica, taught secondary school biology in Ghana, worked in reading research and at the interfaith chaplaincy office. She was sponsored to Virginia Theological Seminary by St. Thomas, graduating in 2010. While there she served as the president of the Missionary Society and traveled extensively for study, research and teaching. After seminary she returned to Texas to serve as Associate Rector/Curate at St. Mary's, Cypress. Meredith+ is thrilled to be called as the next Rector of Grace Galveston!

Meredith+ has a deep love for scripture and theology, and she is passionate about worship, Christian formation, mission and growing communities. These are things that we had included in our Core Values and Vision statements.

Meredith+ very much looks forward to getting to know the people of Grace and the surrounding community. Please feel free to invite her for tea/coffee, a meal, fishing, touring Galveston, or something you especially like to do ... or if you wait long enough, she'll invite you! When not at Grace, I know you will probably find her exploring new places, hosting dinner parties, reading, doing something craft-related, re-learning the piano, walking on the beach, or planning a scuba trip.

Our new Rector's first day at Grace will be Sunday, July 1st, the same day as Bishop Doyle's visit. Before then she will be keeping all of us in her prayers, leaving St. Mary's, co-directing a session at

Camp Allen, attending a weeklong conference, moving and much more. She will also be visiting Grace, meeting with some of you and moving into a condo until the rectory is ready.

Are you wondering what to call your new Rector? She prefers to be called Rev. Meredith.

As I have said many times I feel blessed to be a member of this congregation and I know that you will embrace and welcome Meredith+ as she will embrace us. She definitely has a strong spiritual connection to Grace.

We put a third coat of finish on the Silk Purse tree stump angel. The next step there is adding landscaping around the angel. If you have any suggestions on that please let us or Shirley know. The caladiums and elephant ears planted on the north side of the building are up now and look nice. We have reglazed part of window on Jinkins Hall on a trial basis. All of the windows there need deglazing - a lot of work! A ceiling board in the church carriage entry was painted as was the church sign on Broadway.

Junior Warden's report

The church stained glass window repairs are continuing. The two large windows in the chapel were in bad shape but they have now been repaired as have the three smaller windows around the door on the west end of the church. The faded plexiglass protective covering over the chapel windows has been replaced with clear Lexan which is much stronger. It is properly vented top and bottom to prevent heat and moisture buildup. Now you can see the stained glass clearly from the outside! We are getting an estimate for repairing the three large church windows on that side of the church.

BELL TOWERS DELIVERY METHOD BEING EVAULATED

Over the last several months we have been looking at the most effective way to get the Bell Tower out to you. We are having an increasing problem getting the Bell Tower delivered in a timely fashion. Three months ago it took over 20 days for the Bell Tower to be delivered using bulk mail and last month over 13 days. With the number we mail using first class postage for everyone would be cost prohibitive.

After a lot of discussion, the decision we came to was to email the Bell Tower to everyone who has an email and only mail the Bell Tower to parishioners that request the Bell Tower to be mailed to them. These Bell Towers will be mailed first class and we will no longer use bulk mail to deliver the Bell Tower. This will be implemented with the July Bell Tower.
