The mission of the Altar Guild is to prepare the church for services throughout the church liturgical calendar year as well as for specialized services such as weddings and funerals. Altar Angels are responsible for preparing and maintaining a variety of materials and vessels for the services. These responsibilities include but are not limited to the following:

- Prepare the hangings
- Prepare and maintain the linens
- Replacing and trimming of the candles
- Care of the brass and silver
- Preparation of the Oblation Table
- Preparation of the Altar and Credence Table
- Placement of flowers
- Hymn boards, bulletins, readings
- Washing linens and caring for Rector's robes and stoles
- Stocking the sacristy

Serving with the Altar Guild is as rewarding as it is challenging. Our numbers are fewer than in the past and new members, as well as returning former members, will be most welcome. The work of the Altar Guild is fundamental to the function and beauty of the services at Grace from which we all draw inspiration and spiritual comfort.


New friends were made and I intend to join them for as many years as the Lord gives me.

Please pray for our continued culinary success and know that I welcome any new interested cooks to join us in St. Martha's kitchen




### Time to sign-up for summer Camp

FROM SR. WARDEN ELLA ANDERSON:

Father Paul's March 21 sermon talked about characteristics of a fruitful congregation, based on Robert Schnase's book, "Five Practices of a Fruitful Congregation." One of those practices is "radical hospitality." A note I received from a parishioner expressed the thought that "the definition of radical hospitality is welcoming others as Christ has welcomed us. This parishioner observed that that is a very high bar, and wondered if we as a church welcome others as Christ has welcomed us? This person admitted that "as an individual I don't live up to the standard of radical hospitality."

An excerpt from an internet discussion about the book explains that

"Christian hospitality refers to the active desire to invite, welcome, receive, and care for those who are strangers so that they find a spiritual home and discover for themselves the unending richness of life in Christ. It describes a genuine love for others who are not yet a part of the faith community; an outward focus, a reaching out to those not yet known, a love that motivates church members to openness and adaptability, willingness to change behaviors in order to accommodate the needs and receive the talents of newcomers. Beyond intention, hospitality practices the gracious love of Christ, respects the dignity of others, and expresses God's invitation to others, not our own. (p.11) Radical means "drastically different from the ordinary practice, outside the normal," and so it provokes practices that exceed expectations, that go the second mile, that take welcoming the stranger to the max. It means people offering the absolute utmost of themselves, their creativity, their abilities, and their energy to offer the gracious invitation and reception of Christ to others. (p.21)"

I believe that we, as a congregation, certainly have the "active desire to invite, welcome, receive, and care for those who are strangers so that they find a spiritual home and discover for themselves the unending richness of life in Christ." Do we actively practice "radical" hospitality, i.e., "drastically different from the ordinary practice?" Obviously, that means more than "Hi, how are you...welcome to Grace church" on Sunday morning.

Without a doubt, some of us do that... "exceed expectations, go the second (or third or thirtieth) mile, take welcoming the stranger to the max, offering the absolute utmost of themselves..." A number of our parishioners do that, within the context of "drawing" people into our church family, and, subsequently, towards a relationship with Christ.....AND.....in just the context of drawing people towards a relationship with Christ in general. Your Senior Warden, for one, absolutely does not practice radical hospitality nearly as much as I should. What a great "inspiration" from this parishioner...to be more aware.....and to be more "radical" in my hospitality!!

We pray to God for those we love, but see no longer;  
Grant them your peace through Jesus Christ our Lord.

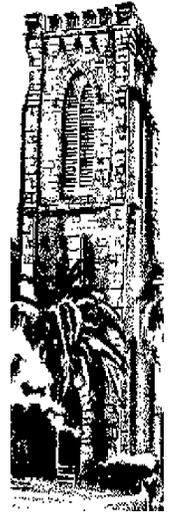
